Installing the offline Reader - PC



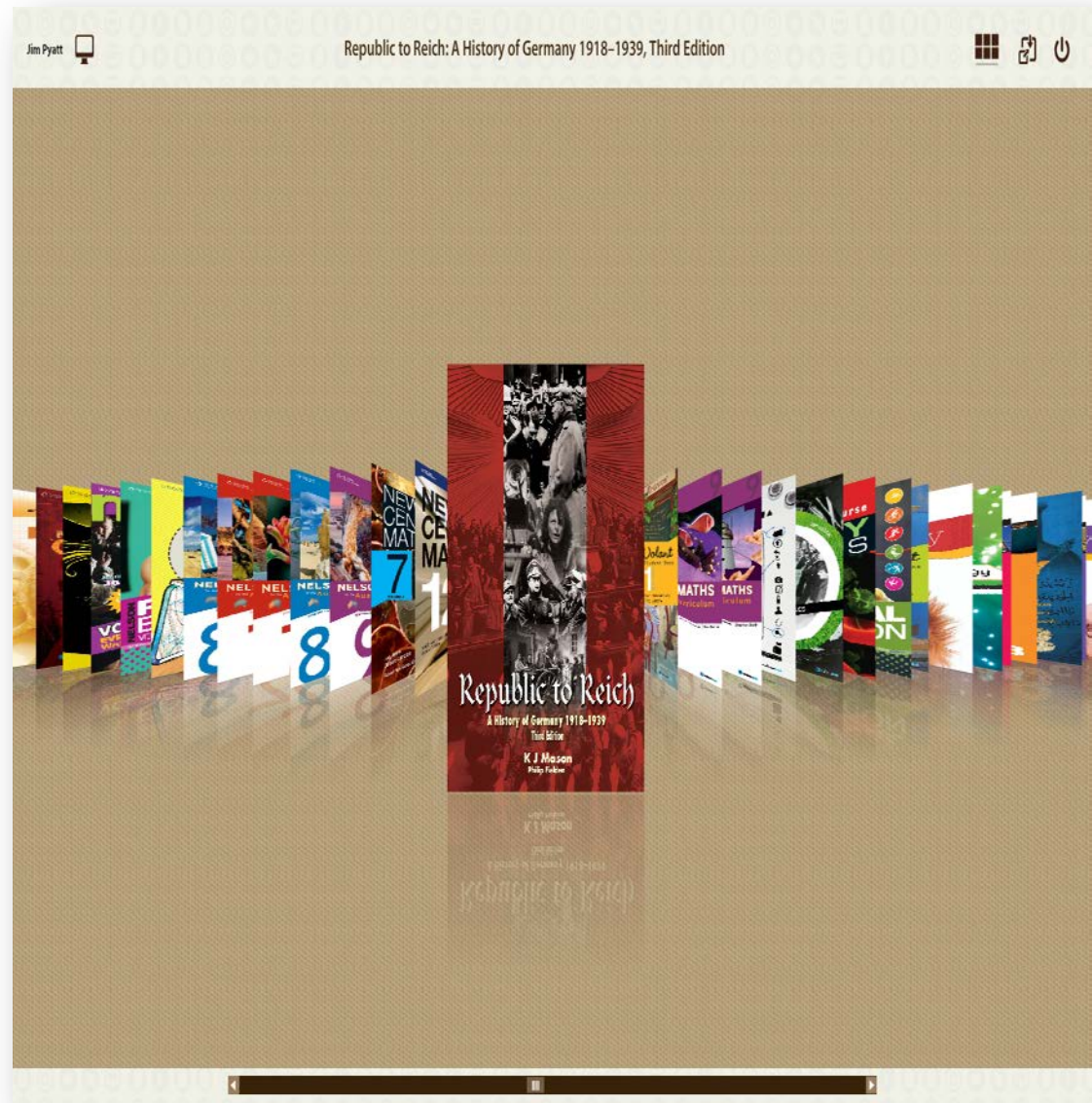
NelsonNetBook Offline Reader

This guide is to assist with downloading and using the NelsonNetBook offline reader for windows based PC's.

The offline reader allows users to view downloaded eBooks on their PC/laptop and read them offline.

While an **internet connection** is required in order to sign into the application, the reading of a downloaded eBook **does not require internet streaming**.

Please note that you only need to download the offline reader once.



Step one

You will need Adobe Air installed on your PC in order to run the offline NelsonNetBook. To install Adobe Air go to <http://get.adobe.com/air/> and click onto the **“Download Now”** link .

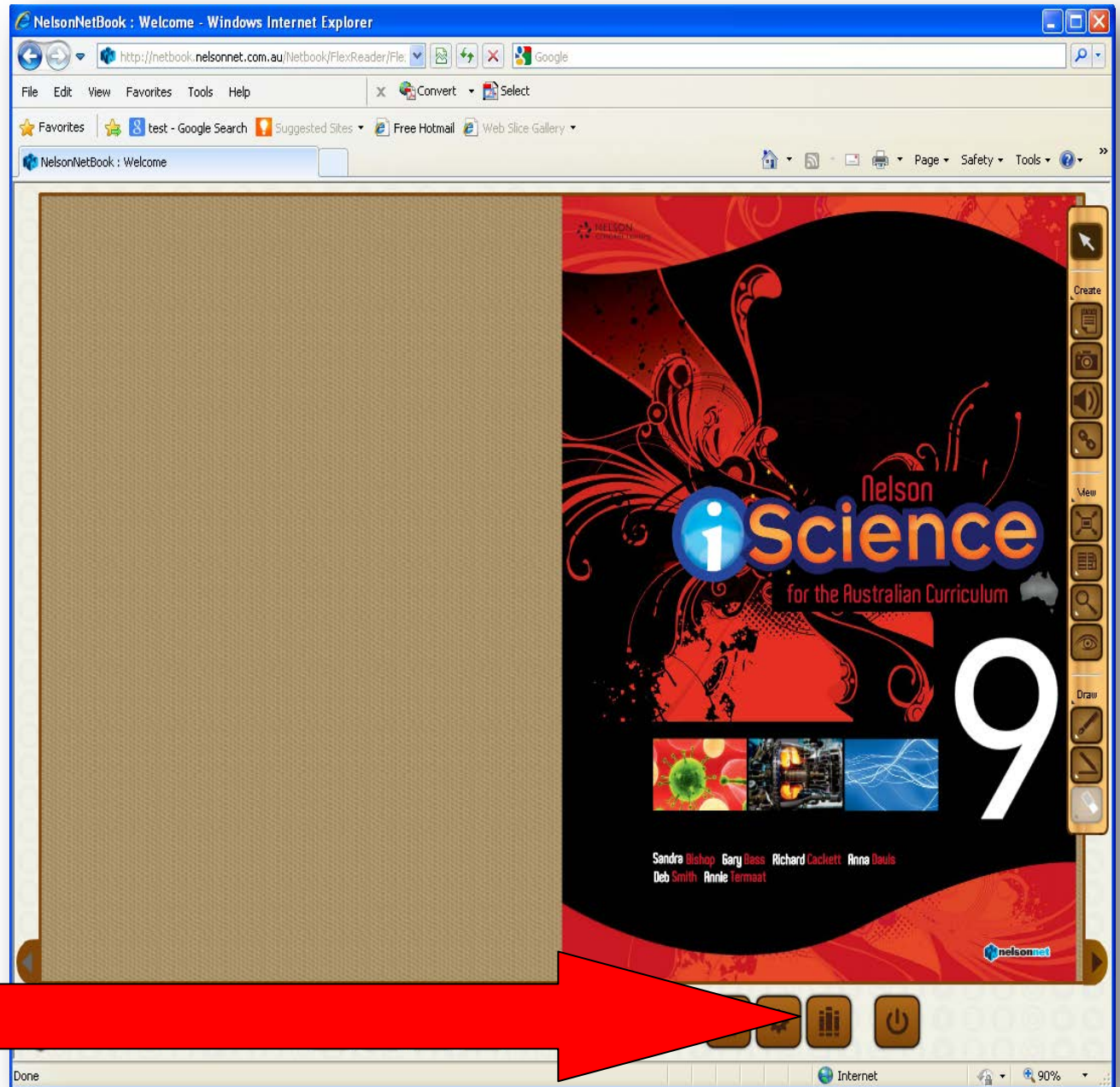

Click on the "My Books" icon



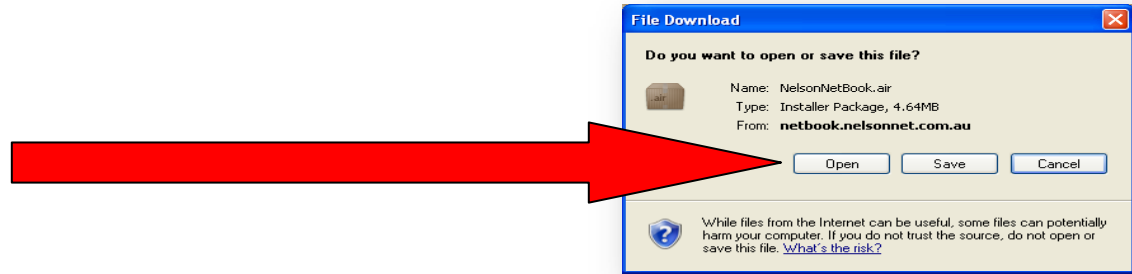
Step four

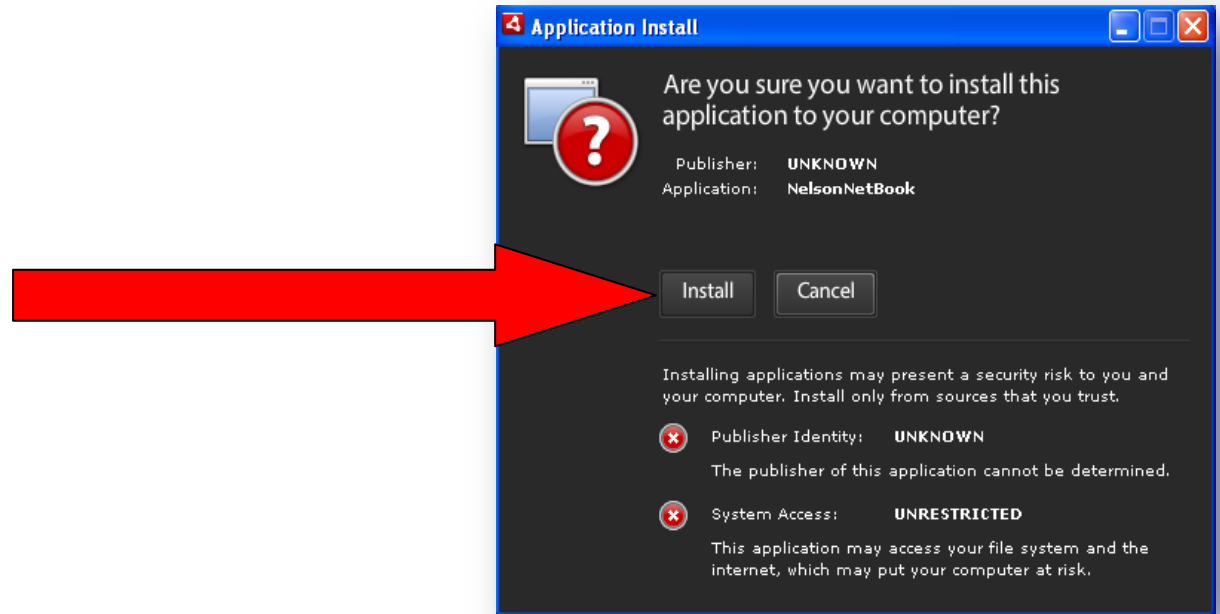
Step five

Step six

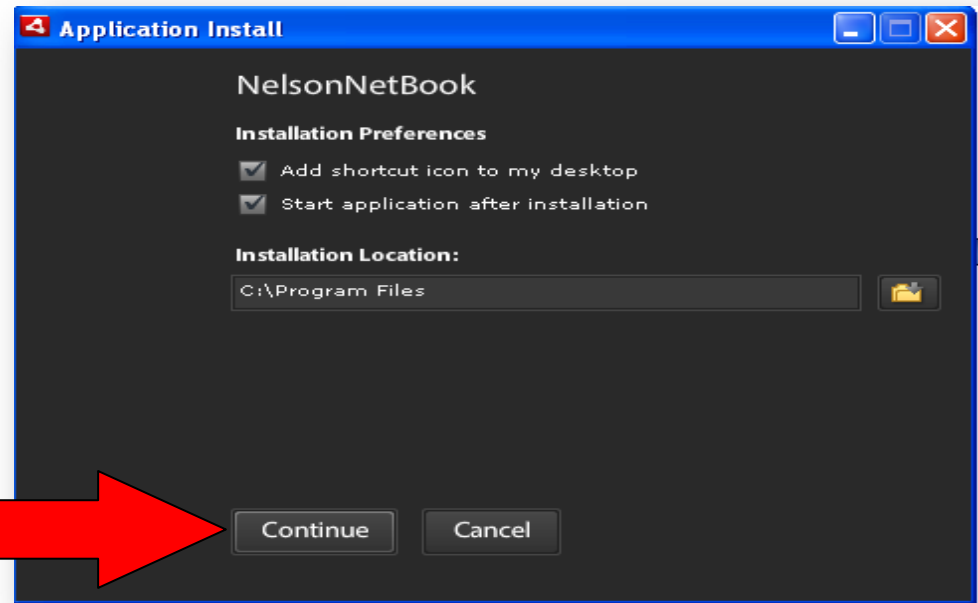
Select "Install"

- Install the application to your computer (C:\Program files)




Confirm by pressing **"Continue"**
