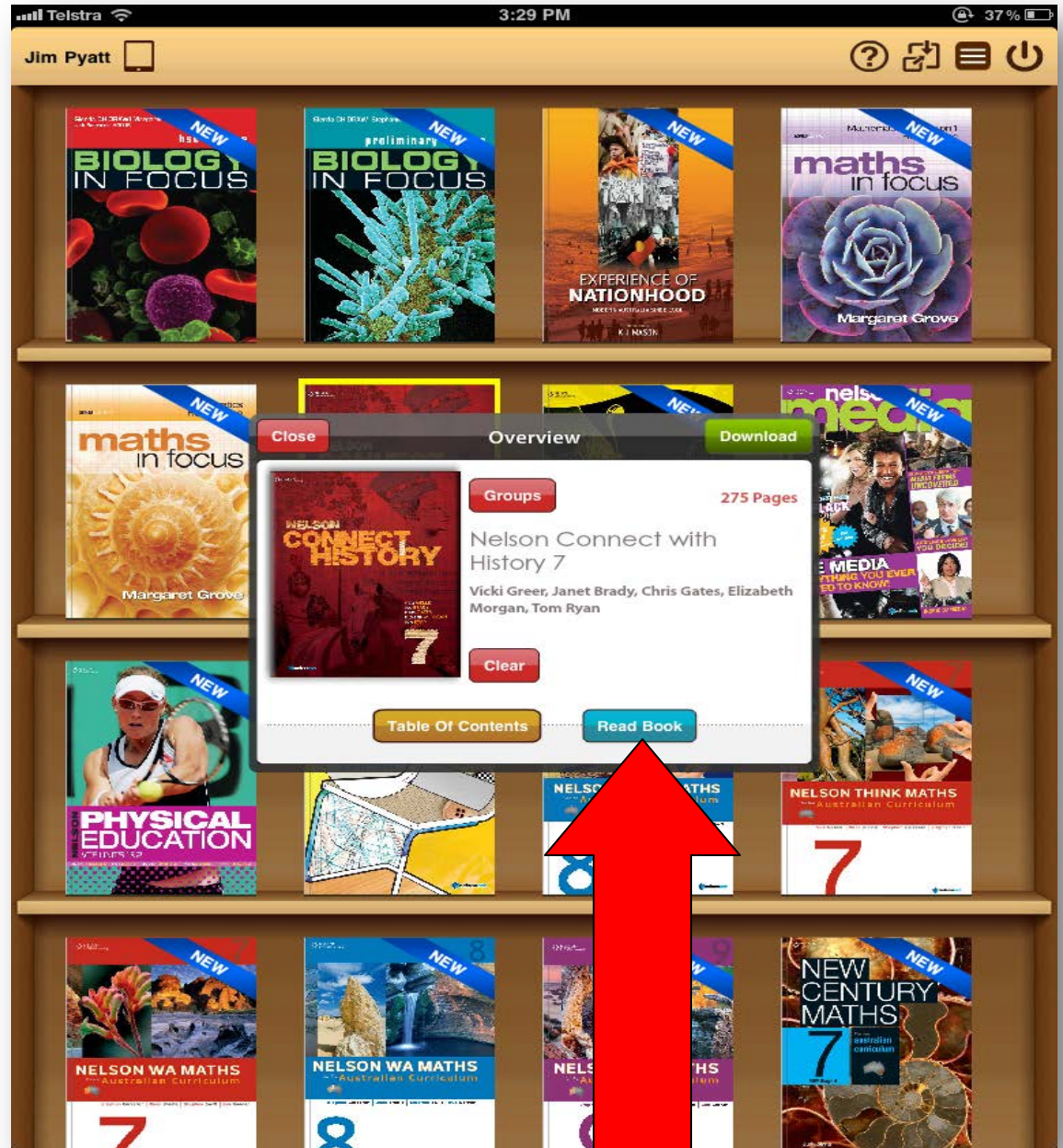
The Bookshelf

After signing into the NelsonNetBook iPad app you will automatically be taken to your bookshelf. You will be able to see all of the eBooks that you have access to.



Reading your eBook

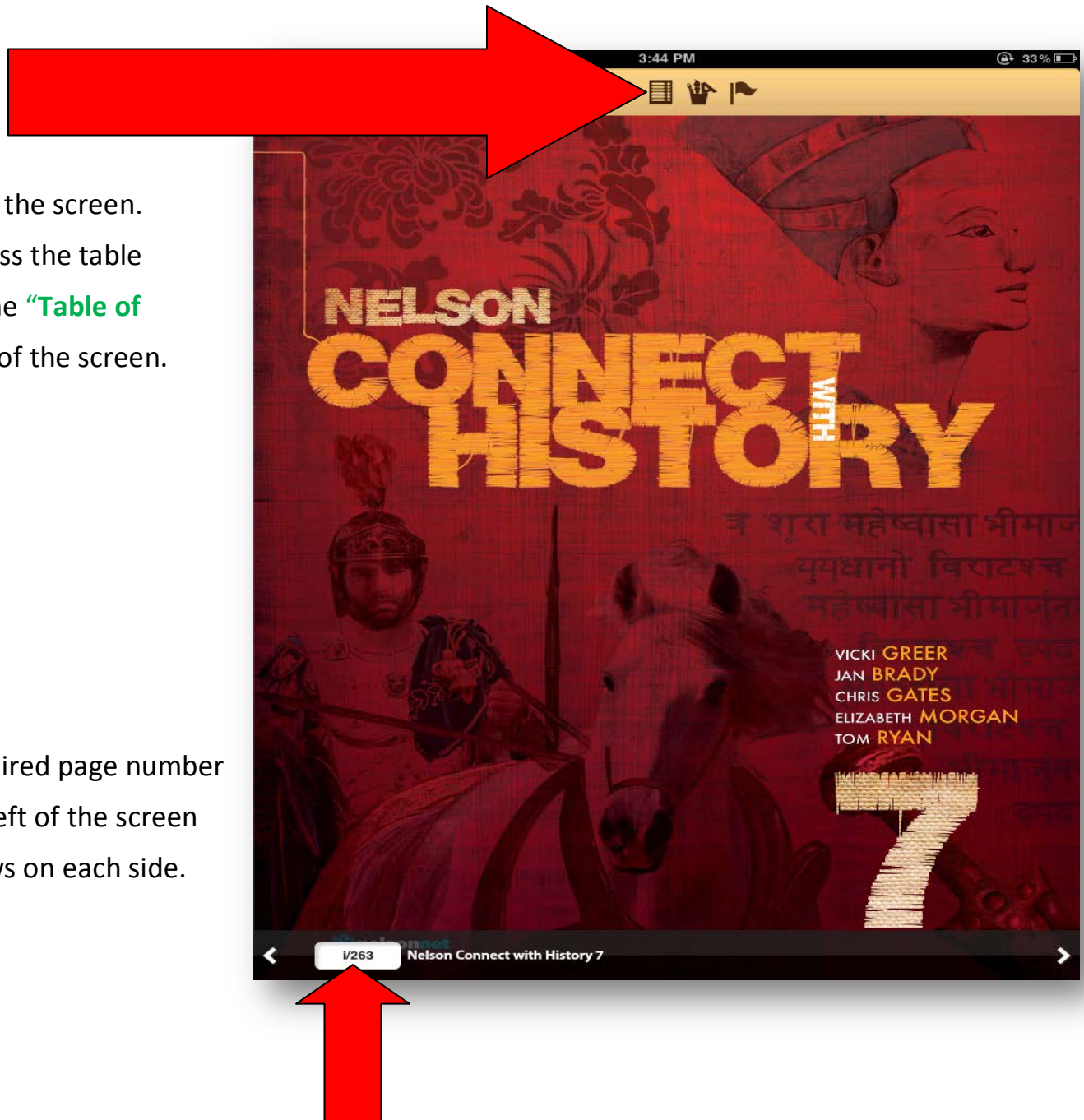
To access the eBook simply press the cover of the desired title from your bookshelf and select **“Read Book”**



Navigating the eBook

To flip pages simply swipe the screen. Alternatively you can access the table of contents by selecting the “**Table of Contents**” icon at the top of the screen.

You can also enter the desired page number in the box at the bottom left of the screen or simply select the arrows on each side.

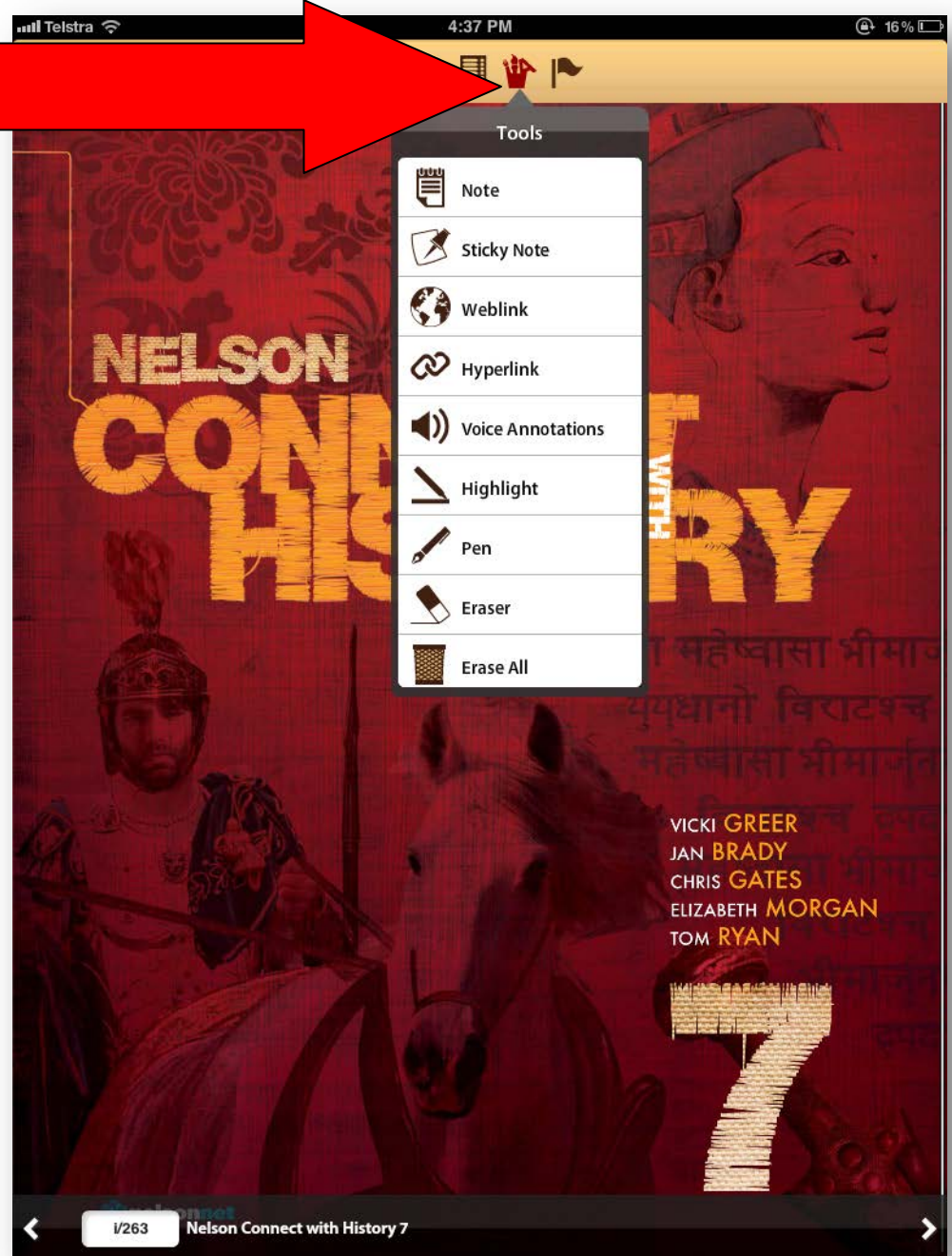


Accessing the Tools Menu

To select the **Tools** menu simply select the **“Tools”** icon on the top.

In the **Tools** Menu you can.

- Add **Notes** to your eBook
- Add **Weblinks** to your eBook
- Add **HyperLinks** to your eBook
- Add **Voice Annotations** to your eBook
- Highlight Text and use the **Pen** Feature

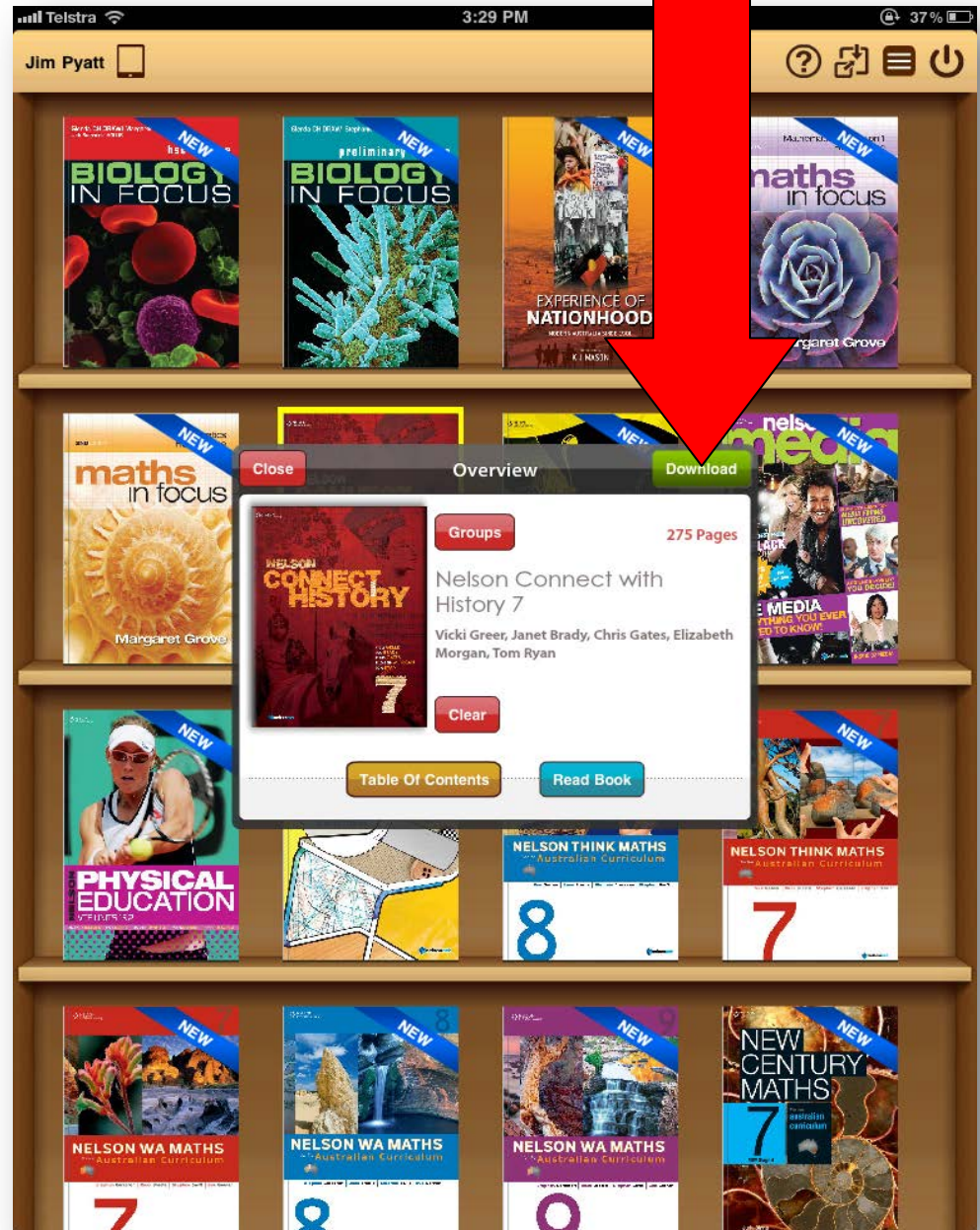


Downloading an Offline Version of an eBook

Downloading an eBook allows you to read the eBook without the need to stream content from the internet.

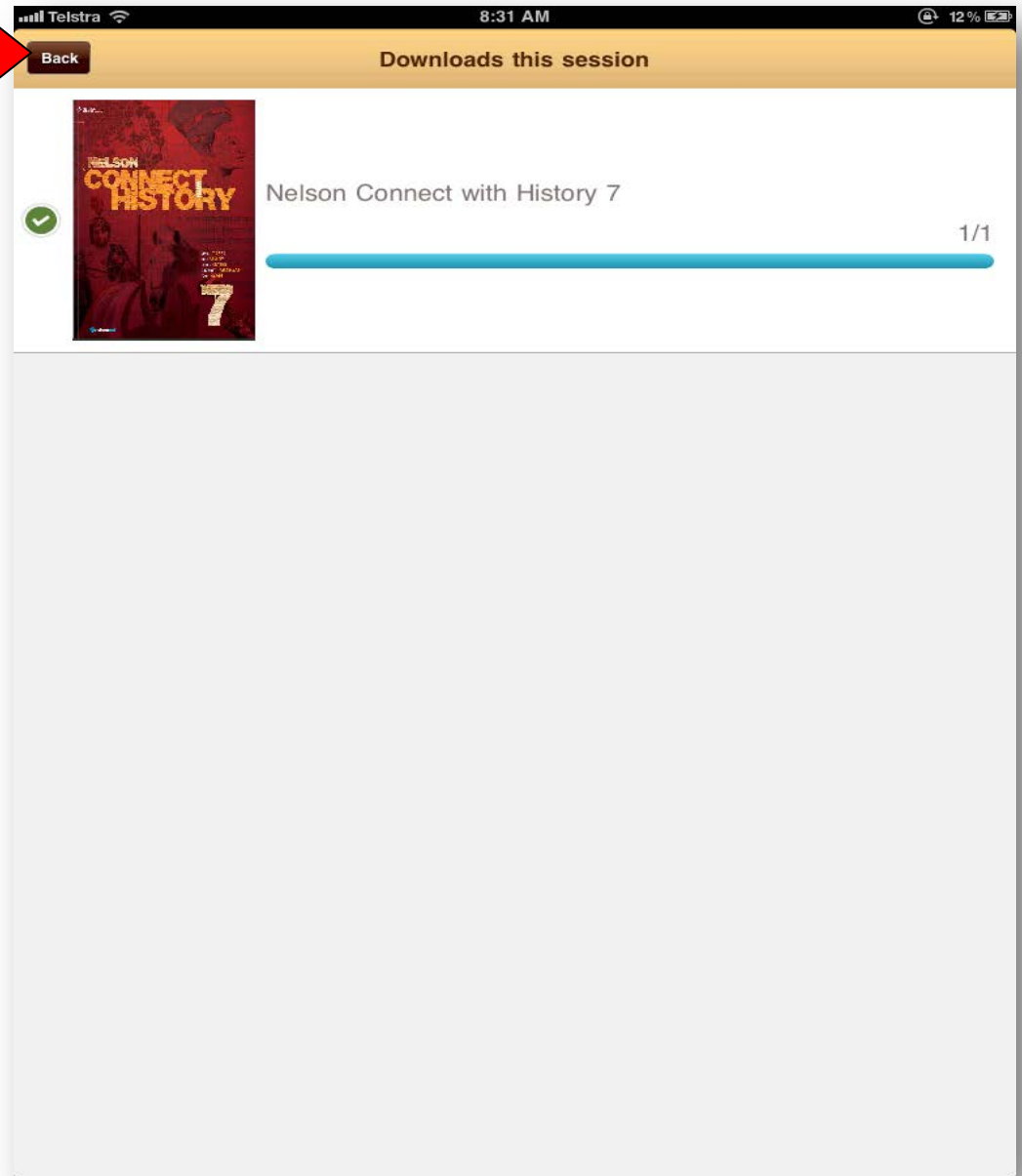
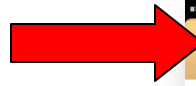
Please Note: While you can read a downloaded eBook offline you will need to be online in order to sign into the NelsonNetBook app. This is so that we can validate you as a NelsonNet customer.

To begin Downloading an eBook simply select the title from your Bookshelf and select **“Download”**

After the eBook has completed downloading
simply select **“Back”** to return to your
bookshelf.



Accessing “Hotspots” from your eBook

Throughout your eBook you will have “Hotspots”. Selecting these will allow you to access various resources such as.

- Weblinks
- Worksheets
- Skill sheets
- Quizzes
- Puzzle Sheets
- Interactives
- Fact sheets

To access these simply press the desired resource.

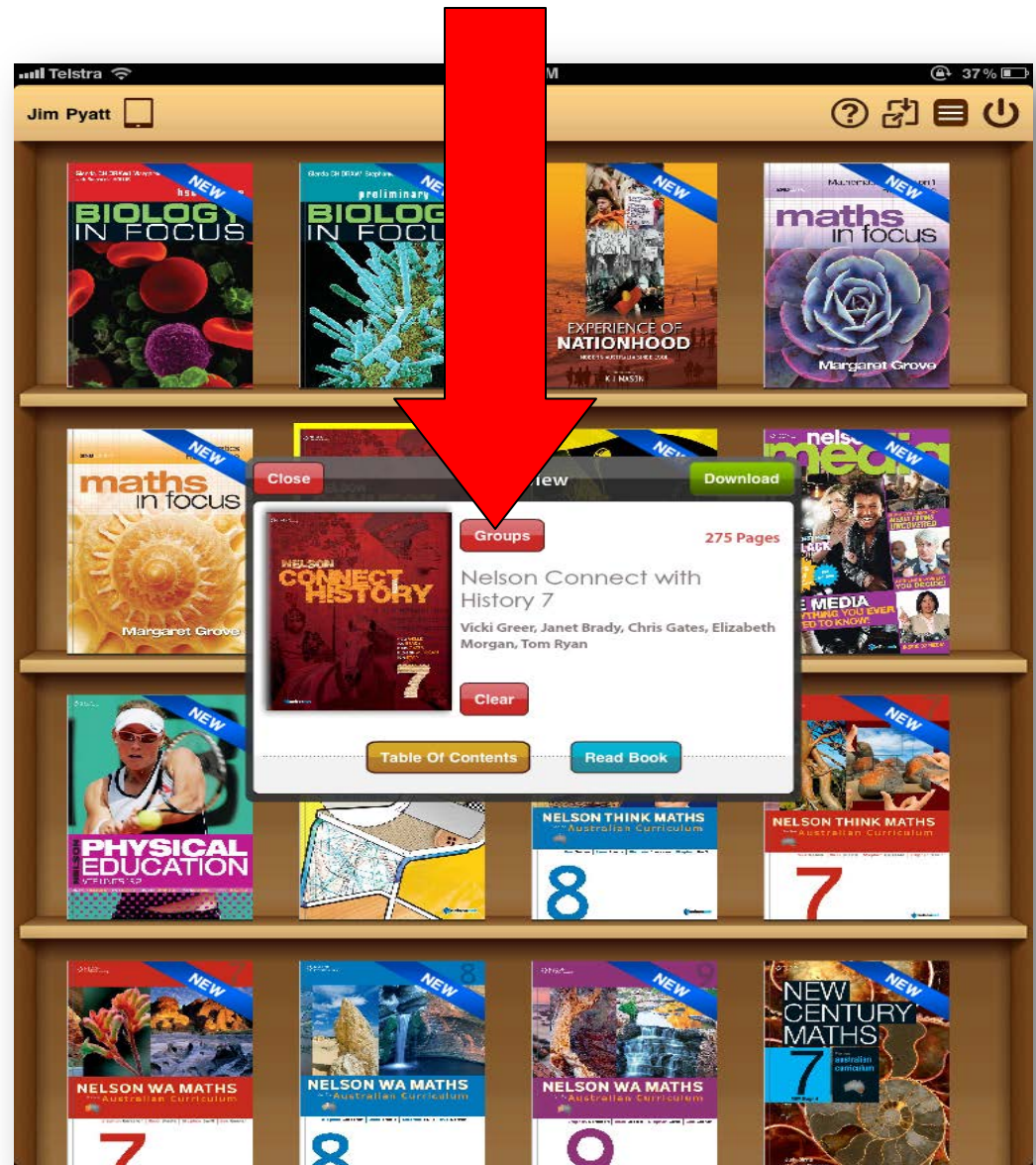

How to join a group
